Spillages of water on floor causing slips	Customers Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ All spillages cleaned up immediately and signs placed where possible ▪ First Aid supplies available ▪ Accidents recorded on Accident Report Forms
Equipment storage	Customers Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Equipment stored in locked store room
Unauthorised access	Customers Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Doors operate on a Maglock system/staff activated only ▪ Disclaimers forms must be signed/checked before entry ▪ Coloured band system in place for sessions
Damaged surface		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Area checked daily ▪ Defects procedure in place

Risk: Collision

Collision with other person, wall or equipment	Customers Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Spectators must watch from the cafe ▪ Children under 18 must wear helmets & we strongly recommend that they wear pads as well ▪ Skate park always marshalled by at least 1 person

Lack of First Aid provision	Customers Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ See First Aid Risk Assessment ▪ First Aid supplies available ▪ Accidents recorded on Accident Report Forms
Risk: Glazing		
Equipment impact with glazing	Customers Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Toughened glass in accordance with British Standard BS6206(A)

Risk: Environment		
Pigeons in skate park	Customers Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ External company hired to do the hawking
Noise / Communication	Staff Public	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Staff have walkie talkies to communicate to reception & the Duty Manager ▪ Noise risk assessments in place

Temperature	Staff & public	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Temperature guidelines followed
Crowded Skatepark	Public	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coloured band system to account for numbers, to prevent overcrowding. • Marshals in skatepark to maintain numbers. • Marshals to ensure behavior and etiquette is maintained.
Lighting – Lux levels	Staff & public	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily inspections • Light levels as per recommendations
